



17TH Century Ringing Books




The first book on ringing, published in 1668, was *Tintinnalogia: or The Art of Ringing* [ABOVE]. It is believed to have been written by a Richard Duckworth. This is probably the Richard Duckworth who was about this time the Rector of St Martin's, Oxford, when its five bells were recast, and a sixth added, by Richard Keene of Woodstock. All that now remains of the church is Carfax Tower and the bells. The book was printed by W. G. (possibly W. Godbid – see next paragraph) at his shop in St Dunstan's Churchyard in Fleet Street, for Fabian Stedman. It is very scarce, with only a handful of copies in existence now. Even rarer, though, is the second edition, of 1671, of which only one copy is known to survive.

Tintinnalogia was followed, in 1677, by Campanalogia: or The Art of Ringing Improved. This was probably written by Stedman himself. It was printed by W. Godbid for W. S. who is believed to be William Smith, a member of the Society of College Youths, and one of the Stewards of the Society in 1678–9. The first edition of the book is also extremely uncommon, but, like Tintinnalogia, it is the second edition which is rarer. I believe only one copy of this is known, and it sold at Sotheby's in 2005 for £4,560 (hammer price with buyer's premium).

No other books devoted entirely to ringing were published in the 17th Century, but two others included chapters on ringing. R. H. (R. Howlett) produced *The School of Recreation* in 1684, subtitled 'A GUIDE TO THE MOST INGENIOUS EXERCISES OF HUNTING, RIDING, RACING, FIREWORKS, MILITARY DISCIPLINE, THE SCIENCE OF DEFENCE, HAWKING, TENNIS, BOWLING, RINGING, SINGING, COCK-FIGHTING, FOWLING, ANGLING'.

The book must have been popular, since it was reprinted in 1696, 1701, 1710, 1732, and 1736. Whether this was because of the ringing content, or the other delights, we will probably never know! The title page of the 1710 edition is shown below. The first paragraph



of the preface to this edition is 'READER, IN THIS SMALL BOOK YOU WILL FIND SUCH VARIETY OF RECREATIONS, THAT NOTHING OF THE NATURE EVER APPEAR'D SO LIKE ACCOMPLISH'D IN ANY ONE VOLUME, OF WHAT LARGENESS SOEVER...'

The second book published in the 17th century with some ringing content was *The Art of Ringing, also Artificial Fireworks, likewise the Art of Gardening*, by R. White, and published around 1698.

One more book worth mentioning just missed the 17th century, but its writing could well have been started in that century. It is *Campanalogia Improved*, published in 1702, and which ran to five editions between then and 1766.

For anyone interested in these books, one or more edition of each of the first two books mentioned has been reprinted at some time or other – *Tintinnalogia* in 1895 (by 'Bell News', the precursor to *The Ringing World* – not in facsimile), and again in 1970 (by Kingsmead), and *Campanalogia* which was reprinted in 1990 in facsimile by C. Groome. The 1733 (third) edition of *Campanalogia Improved* (in facsimile) was reprinted by C. Groome in 1983. Copies of the reprints occasionally turn up on the internet book sites, and in second-hand bookshops.
