



Training Days

It's top marks for the "Teaching the Teachers" Bell Control course! Andy Wickenden attended.....

Making use of a last minute cancellation, it was with some considerable trepidation that I arrived at Brasted [8, 9-2-2 in G^b] to join the Catherine Lewis Teachers' Road Show on Saturday 24th September!

We were split into three groups, each consisting of one tutor, two students and one guinea pig. Why anyone would volunteer to be put at the mercy of two novice instructors and a few hundredweight of bell on the end of a rope beats me – even with the lure of an exceptionally good free lunch at the Stanhope Arms next door! Reassuringly though, we were taught that should a loose rope end up around a neck, it should be flicked away in a speedy but relaxed and orderly fashion to avoid any unnecessary panic. Quite so.

After a considerable amount of chasing loose ropes and holding of breath, we gradually got our guinea pigs to handle the bells. I did notice however, that the wall clock hanging in the vicinity of our own bell, which had survived a couple of near misses before lunch, had actually been removed on our return!

For a subject that initially seems so involved and complex to get across in one day, it was with great satisfaction that all six students ended up feeling reasonably confident in the teaching of bell control and all three guinea pigs were ringing a bell on their own!

So, thanks to Catherine Lewis, ably assisted by Catherine Heathcote and Frank, for a very useful and well-run course – highly recommended.

Speldhurst Outing

Mike Bullett reports on a venture out to Essex:



A spectacular Norman arch found at St Mary High Ongar.

Our autumn outing this year was to Essex around the M25, the A12 and the A127. A party of 14 gathered at the first tower, St Mary High Ongar, 6, 11-1-0 in F-sharp. Access was via a steepish ladder and one had to dodge the bar holding the trap door at the top. The bells were a pleasant 6

albeit with some slight idiosyncratic behaviour. A mixture from various Doubles methods to *Cambridge Minor* was rung. The church was interesting with some parts dating from Norman times – a photo of a particularly interesting arch at the entrance is shown below.

We then moved on to St Germain Bobbingworth, another pleasant 6, 13-0-3 in G and a ground floor ring – the access being a distinct contrast to the previous tower! A similar mixture of methods was rung here. One slightly odd feature of the church was that there was only one way in and out, via the ringing chamber! Apparently local worshippers have learnt to dodge the ropes as they enter the church and at weddings the congregation leaves first and, most unusually, the bride and bridegroom leave last and then the ringing begins!

There followed a convivial lunch at The Nag's Head, Moreton and a trip to St John the Baptist Epping, an 8, 20-2-0 in E. The bells had all the hallmarks of being an enjoyable ring and had a pleasant tone – at hand stroke at least. Back stroke however was a different matter with 1, 2, 3, 4, and 6 for an unexplained reason being half muffled! This made ringing somewhat difficult and our striking was not as we would have wished and attempts at *Stedman Triples* and *Cambridge Major* failed.

We moved on to the most pleasant ring of the day at All Saints, Theydon Garnon, a 6, 13-3-3 in F. The bells had been rehung and augmented from a 5 to a 6 in 2008, sounded good and went very well. Apart from a failed attempt at *London Minor*, all had a good ring.

The last tower of the day was St Peter South Weald an enjoyable 8, 14-1-3 in F. By half way through our numbers had reduced to 11 but nonetheless we rang a range of 7 and 8 bell methods, including a half course of *Cambridge Major*.

All in all it was a most enjoyable day.

Congratulations to Jane Wilson (and Andy Wroe) from Edenbridge on their engagement, with their wedding planned for next spring.


As the last quarter of the year starts *Kathy Staff* asks, why not add to your collection of Christmas music?
