### **Editorial**

# Ringing at Snodland suspended indefinitely

In our last issue we reported that ringing at Snodland had been temporarily suspended following the quinquennial report as the floors hadn't been surveyed or inspected for a good 20 years. The survey has now been carried out and we regret to have to report that it was found that both the ringing and bell chamber floor, together with the north aisle, need substantial work carried out before they are deemed safe to use again.

The tower is therefore not likely to be available for ringing for some considerable time, at least a year, possibly longer.

# **County 6 Bell Striking Contest**

This year's County Striking Contest took place on a cold but sunny day at West Wickham on 25th September and was judged by Michael Moreton.

Our representatives were All Saints', Maidstone, who finished in third place with 78 faults, just two behind runners-up Tonbridge (Ss Peter & Paul, Tonbridge). The winners were Lewisham District (represented by Beckenham) with 51 faults. Rochester District (Meopham) were 4th and Ashford (Brabourne) finished 5th. The band representing the Canterbury District arrived too late to ring!

#### An enjoyable afternoon at Mereworth

Around 15 people attended the Summer Quarterly Meeting at Mereworth on Saturday 10th July, one of the hottest days of the summer so far. Ringing ranged from Plain Bob and Grandsire to Cambridge, Bourne and Alnwick Surprise Minor - truly something for everyone. A short Business Meeting in the church was followed by cream teas in the churchyard. Once again no new members were elected at the meeting.

#### City of London taken over by District ringers

The decision to have a joint outing with the Tonbridge District to London proved to be a master stroke. No less than 39 ringers from both Districts visited six City churches on Saturday 14th August, including the new 12 at St Magnus the Martyr in Lower Thames Street and the newly available six at St Katharine Cree.

The day started with people crammed into St Magnus' ringing chamber where ringing varied from call changes to Stedman Cinques and Little Bob Maximus. This was followed by the eight at St Olave, Hart Street, where we achieved three leads of Bristol. Most had lunch at the Liberty Bounds pub overlooking the Tower of London before making our way to St Katharine Cree - as good fortune would have it the only church of the day to have a toilet! The eight at Aldgate were next, followed by the best ringing of the day at Christ Church, Spitalfields, where a well struck touch of 8-spliced was rung. The day ended at the soon to be recast 12 at St Michael, Cornhill, and then a quick drink before closing time (7pm!) at the neighbouring Crosse Keys pub.

Not only was the day a great success ringing-wise and socially, but after taking out tower donations the £5 per head tower fee meant that the Bell Restoration Fund benefited to the tune of more than £90. Our grateful thanks to District Ringing Masters James Sawle and Daniel Brady for organising the event and to those from both Districts who ran the towers. Although 26 ringers were involved in the six quarters and one peal, disappointingly very few were from the target group. Nevertheless nine ringers achieved 14 firsts of some kind between them, so the exercise was worth organising. Full details are below.
