

KCACR Youth Officer Role Description

The main responsibility of the Youth Officer is to co-ordinate and promote activities for and communication between young ringers across the whole Association.

The Youth Officer should:

- Have a good knowledge of change ringing with an interest in training, education and youth participation
- Establish (if not already in existence), develop and maintain a contact network of existing young ringers using any medium required (email, Facebook, etc.)
- Establish where young people are ringing so that those who are not yet KCACR members can be contacted and included in any initiatives and events
- Provide news, information and event details for the Kent Young Ringers page of the KCACR website when available
- Encourage and support local District initiatives and events for young ringers
- Encourage, support and organise (where required) County-wide initiatives and events for young ringers including, but not limited to:
 - KCACR Youth Striking Competition
 - Young Ringers' practices
 - Young Ringers' social events
 - Young Ringers' tower outings
- Encourage, support and organise (where required) the County's entries to the Ringing World National Youth Competition
- Provide a report to each meeting of the KCACR General Committee on activities during the preceding weeks/months; attendance at these meetings is optional
- Provide an annual report to the KCACR Annual General Meeting on Easter Monday each year; attendance at this event is optional
