49 rail passengers died and many more were wounded after a commuter train derailed. The 19:43 express train was travelling from Hastings to Charing Cross when at 21:16 it crashed off the rails between Hither Green and Grove Park stations near the Southern Region Continental goods depot, on the bridge which crosses the South Circular Road.

In memoriam. Rung to commemorate the 60th Anniversary of the train crash near St. John's station on 4th December 1957.

Two trains crashed in dense fog just outside Lewisham - 90 people were killed and nearly 200 more were injured. The crash deflected one of the trains into an overbridge, which then collapsed onto the packed carriages below that were carrying 2,000 evenina rush commuters.



Maurice Coombs, whose father Thomas Coombs died in the crash, came to St John's church to listen to the quarter peal.

We were very pleased that we were able to raise a band of 6 to ring for Midnight Mass at St Alfege, Greenwich this Christmas.

One of our team, David Connearn recently rang his first quarter on the treble at the first attempt at Rotherhithe on Saturday 30th December, 1260 Grandsire Doubles, with Edward Gormley ringing the tenor.

Ringing Master, Nick Wilkins. Practices have been held monthly and I am still trying to ensure that all the towers in the district are visited. Many of the practices have been on Friday evenings however four have been on Saturdays. I am keen to reach out to more ringers across the District as although the practices are generally well attended it tends to be by the same people, I would really like to encourage ringers from other towers to come along too. Ringing is tailored to who attends so should be inclusive. I am concerned at the general health of ringing as there are a few towers in the district where there is little ringing taking place and I would like to actively try and do something about this particularly holding practices at these towers.

The Lewisham District won the County 8 bell striking Competition in June and the district call change competition was won by the home band at St Mary Cray last November. Chelsfield won the district striking competition in Farningham in March. I would encourage as many towers as possible to enter the district call-change competition in November and the striking competition in the New Year.

I am proposing to hold a Quarter Peal week  $9^{th} - 18^{th}$  March which would include the weekends at either end of the week. I will be looking at key people in the district to assist and try and get a quarter rung in all the towers in the district if at all possible.

Natalie Slator thanked Nick for organising the practices and felt that everyone was made very welcome whatever their level of ringing and he was more than welcome to use Erith CC for a practice.

Doug Fisher put forward a suggestion that perhaps a practice night 'away-day' where a tower such as Chelsfield went to another tower where less ringing takes place instead of attending Chelsfield that Monday. Mark Backhouse picked up on this and suggested that it could be that if there was a 5<sup>th</sup> practice night in a month then that be the night for an away day. Others agreed that this would be a nice idea to try and implement.

**Training Officer, Alex Fishburn.** Unfortunately Alex couldn't attend this meeting and was standing down due to it being his last year at university and therefore lack of time to dedicate to the role. It was believed that there had been at least two training events during the year; one a ringing up and down in peal and another of plain hunt however this one ended up more as a handling clinic to give the participants better bell control in order to assist their plain hunt.

**Newsletter Editor, Rupert Cheeseman.** Thank you for all who contribute to the content of the newsletter, it is appreciated. The newsletter is what you make it, the more items submitted make a better newsletter. If you would like colour version it is available for printing on the district website.

Rupert was thanked for continuing to compile it for us.

#### 7. Proposed Rule Changes

The meeting discussed the proposed rule change which, subject to further discussion at the General Committee meeting in November, will be voted on at the County AGM on Easter Monday, 2nd April. The County had asked for

feedback in time for the meeting in November. Details of the proposals have been circulated to the towers in advance and copies were made available at the meeting. To enable further discussions to take place in towers the information was also in the current newsletter circulated today.

The proposal is to replace the Ringing Master and Chairman of the districts with the single position of Master, which is commonplace in other ringing associations.

Comments from those attending were that overall intention was positive in that it focused the business of County and District more towards actual ringing, and reduction of the overall size of the committee, however there were strong concerns that it put far too much pressure on just one person. It only works if there is the right person in each district to have the time available to take on the many facets of the role. They would have to act in the role of Ringing Master as we know it, attend both the County and district meetings, chairing the latter. Different skills are required in these roles and to find someone who is skilled at all of them may be a tall order. The District Reps reported that it had been suggested that the Master at County level would have sub-committees to assist with some of the workload, but this is not clear in the proposal. If so, the incumbent would need to be a good delegator and have people happy to be delegated to.

The District would like clarification on

who could represent the Master at the County meeting if they were unable to attend.

when the changes come in to affect, and whether there were different timelines for County and District. One part of the rule change proposal states it would be immediately after the AGM if the change was supported, another part stated November.

the term of office for the County Master - the rule change states 3 years, but is that only an election every third year or re-elected annually?

Mark Backhouse proposed that a new wording be put to the County for consideration "The District Master and one other district representative will serve on the committee for the ensuing year". This was seconded by Les Brett and passed by the meeting.

The Chair and the Secretary will contact the county for the above clarifications, the district reps will take our feedback to the next county meeting and it will be an agenda item for January to discuss further to give people the best information with which to make a decision and vote at the County AGM.

#### 9. KCACR report on the meeting held on 27<sup>th</sup> August 16

It was agreed that we will prepare & conduct a census across all towers in the Association to allow us to better understand the state of ringing today

The accounts have now been audited and just need to be submitted to the Charities Commission. The Auditor has commented that the accounts are far too complicated, and this will be reviewed with him, including how the Districts account for the income from the sale of clothing books

It was agreed that the recruitment/training plan as part of the Armistice Day proposal will be dropped for the time being due to lack of resources, however the idea will be revisited

Diocesan Safeguarding Training has now started to be arranged and delivered, so all towers should be aware of this The trailer has been ordered for the mobile ring, currently due to be delivered sometime around mid-October. Pricing for the addition of lettering to the bells has also been received and this will be passed to David Cawley who would like to pay for 'KCACR' to be put on each one

Faculty applications can now be made entirely online

Following the last meeting, it has been decided we will only provide one printed copy of the next handbook for every tower, and anyone else wanting a printed copy will be able to place an order at a cost of £4 from December and these will be available for collection At the AGM as normal. Otherwise the handbook will be available online, and it
