## **50 YEARS OF THE BELLS OF ST ALPHEGE, WHITSTABLE**

There may be some older members who remember the cover story of The Ringing World on 12<sup>th</sup> September 1969 (No. 3047), which celebrated the installation of a new light ring (3-1-13) of six at St Alphege, then parish church of Seasalter, situated in Whitstable High Street. Fifty years later there are still members of the ringing community, and indeed the church, who shared the excitement at the time and so Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> September 2019, fifty years to the day of the dedication of the bells by the Bishop of Dover, seemed a fitting occasion for a celebration.



Proceedings began early in the morning with a peal of 5040 Cambridge and Plain Bob Minor on the original six bells, the ring having been augmented to eight in 1973. Stephen Jakeman, a member of the original band, organised and conducted the peal, which included current and former members and one who rang in the first peal in 1970. The morning's ringing came round in fine style after 2 hours 29 minutes and had been much appreciated by passing townsfolk and the clientele of the church café. You may have read the report of this in the previous newsletter.



It was just as well that Whitstable was bathed in late summer sunshine during the afternoon, as two special installations were erected outside on the church forecourt. On one side, the delightful Madams Court Mini Ring from Frinsted, kindly brought over by Martin Hooker, and on the other, Trevor Arnold's intriguing Maypole Bell ringing simulator. These two attracted not only visiting ringers, who arrived to join in the fun, but also many members of the public, including some very young ones, whose Saturday afternoon was enlivened by an authentic ad hoc ringing experience.

Meanwhile, up in the tower, all eight bells were being put to good use, with friends old and new being welcomed and many reminiscences being exchanged. The afternoon was not without drama, however, as someone managed to break the lock on the tower access hatch, trapping the younger members of the St Alphege band in the ringing room. Fortunately the adults also present decided the best thing to do was for everyone to carry on ringing and in fact the youngsters even practised some new skills whilst those down below figured out how to release them. In the end, brute force was successful and the tower supply of Smarties came in useful for sustaining them during their ordeal.



A congregation of ringers and church members then joined in a joyful celebration Evensong, which included Psalm 150 and a reading from Numbers 10: 1 -10, two elements of the original dedication service. Revd Rachel Webbley, Team Rector of the Whitstable Team Ministry, gave what was later described as a 'cracking' sermon and the choir sang Vaughan Williams' *Let all the world in every corner sing,* with its glorious bell-like accompaniment by guest organist Stephen Barker. The congregation was most generous in giving to a collection for the rehanging of the chiming bell in a sister church of the Whitstable Team, St John's, Swalecliffe.

No celebration would be complete without tea and cake! Aided by their good friends from the All Saints, Whitstable band, the hosts laid on a delicious spread, which was polished off in no time. A celebration cake decorated with six golden bells was cut by Revd David Cawley, the first Ringing Master, and Revd Rachel Webbley. Revd David, to whom the band and church owe a huge debt of gratitude, was a lay reader at St



Alphege when he instigated the project to install the bells back in 1969. With the help of his collection of old photos and documents, he explained to the assembled company how it had all come about and how the ringers had been trained up from scratch at neighbouring towers beforehand.



The only member of that original band still ringing in the tower (although others are ringing elsewhere) is John Legg, who served as Ringing Master from 1970 to 2014. He went on to describe some of the ringing highlights over the years, including the augmentation, notable peals, competition wins and those infamous boating holidays. Since the foundation of the Whitstable Team Ministry in 1984, the church has been known as St Alphege, Whitstable, although old habits die hard in ringing circles, where the name of Seasalter still endures.

After a great day of celebration, we now turn towards the

future and with an influx of new young ringers, current Ringing Master Ben Legg and the rest of the band at St Alphege are looking forward to the next fifty years of our wonderful little bells.

## The Thanet and Quex Society Outing - Saturday 5th October

Once the bells had been raised, Rounds, Call changes, Bob doubles, Plain hunt were rung. The bells all had a different plain coloured sally which made food for thought. Do the locals call changes by colour or number?

Warhorne – tower three. These little six were much more user friendly. Here we ventured to ring Stedman doubles, Cambridge minor along with the usual rounds, call changes and plain hunt. Everyone seemed to like these bells.

Now it was time for lunch and light refreshment. The County Member at Lympne being the chosen venue. Pre ordering of food had been arranged in advance. 35 sat down for lunch which Len said had been very good and well served. Malcolm and I having not pre booked our lunch, we took ourselves off to the Dukes Head at Ham Street for a pre birthday lunch for Mr.B. We had no idea what it would be like but what we can say is that we had a very good, home cooked meal, in a very clean, friendly pub. We can highly recommend it but you could need to take your doggy bag with you. The portions were very large.

Lunch break, came to an end and then on to our forth tower.

Lympne. The spectacular view across the Romney Marsh from the back of the church yard was admired by a few of us before climbing the open spiral staircase to the ringing chamber. Here it was discovered that some of the bells would have been better for the ringers, if one leg had been a little longer than the other! Thus said these bells were and are a delightful ring of 8. The usual rounds, call changes were rung also Stedman and Bob triples and an attempt at Cambridge Major.

Saltwood - our fifth tower of the day were not so easy and are quite heavy going and odd struck. The tower isn't very big and we made quite a cosy gathering. Nothing adventurous was rung here but everyone rang something.

By now I was certainly was feeling a little tired but one more tower was on the list so off we went again.

Folkestone – tower number six, the last of the day a delightful, heavy ring of 8 bells. If you haven't prior information as to getting into the tower it can prove a little difficult to find the staircase. Fortunately a visit for Mr.B and I earlier this year made for no problem this time! Rounds, Call changes, Plain hunt, Stedman and Bob triples were rung and the bells were enjoyed by all.

And finally it was time to call it a day. Given the number of ringers and level of skill of said ringers, I can say that we had a very friendly, enjoyable day. The enthusiasm shown by all the ringers is praise worthy .The weather couldn't have been better, dry crisp air, not cold and no rain. A big thank you to those who did all of

the organising, from the three of us at Ash and for inviting us to join you on the day out, but please, one request for next time. Could the first tower be just a little nearer to home?

## **KENT YOUNG RINGERS CONTEST @ STURRY on 2nd NOV 2019**

The 4th KCACR Young Ringers' Contest was held at Sturry on a very wild and wet afternoon.

24 youngsters aged from 9 to 22 gathered after battling the wind and the rain from the far reaches of Kent. A wonderful tea and very welcome hot drinks greeted us inside the church where Trevor Arnold had set up his Maypole Mini Ring. We found a little spot for the judge... as suitable as possible, given the weather; the draw took place and an afternoon of really lovely ringing got underway.

The ringers of Kent should be very proud of the standard of ringing being produced by our younger generation. Various activities were on hand to occupy us while not ringing: the Maypole Mini Ring (two teams took advantage of this to practice their test piece, having not been able to practice beforehand!), a tricky Word search, a quiz devised by Adam Moore, handbells in the very warm porch, biscuits to decorate with various methods and bell motifs as well as hanging around the door to listen to the competing teams.

Full teams from the Canterbury, Lewisham and Tonbridge Districts entered along with a band made up of 3 ringers from each of the Maidstone and Rochester Districts. These four teams rang Call Changes.

The identity of the judge as Daniel Jarvis, taking a weekend out of his university studies in Liverpool, was revealed and introduced to the assembled throng of teams and supporters.

Daniel explained his system of marking and proceeded to give the results. The teams representing the Districts were awarded the following results:

Canterbury: 70%: Lewisham: 75% "Maidchester": 84%

and the Trophy winners were Tonbridge with 86%

Certificates were presented to the teams and the Reverend David Cawley presented the trophy to the Tonbridge team. Congratulations to them and many thanks to everyone for taking part.

7. **Any Other Business** - County Training officer David Grimwood had emailed district chairman to announce that he was putting together a training budget and asked what training was being planned in each district. # The KCACR Canterbury District - Annual District Meeting Saturday 12th October 2019 at Canterbury, St Dunstans

Ringing began at 3pm under the guidance of ringing master Ben Legg. The service at 4.15pm was conducted by Samuel Keeler-Walker with Susan Record playing the organ.

Tea was served by the St. Dunstans ringers in the church hall.

The Chairman, Mike Little opened the meeting by welcoming everyone to St. Dunstans.

**1. Apologies for Absence** were received from, Debbie Aris, Dennis Brandrick, Mary and Tony Bridges, Andrew Corby, Philip Elderton, Rev. Stanley Evans, Chris and Janet Godfrey, Philip Hills, Jo Horton, Paul Johnson, Belinda Moyna, John Paramor, Freda Parker, Adam Redgwell, David Sheekey, Zoe and Malcolm Storey, Ian White and the Bekesbourne band.

- 2. Minutes of the last two meetings were taken as read on a proposal from Becky Holliday seconded by Sarat White. The chairman signed the minutes as a true record.
- 3. Matters Arising There were no matters arising.
- 4. Election of New Members No new members were proposed for election to the Association.
- 5. **Presentation of Certificates -** There were no members present to receive membership certificates.
- 6. The Collection This amounted to £47.53 of which £23.77 went to St Dunstans and £23.76 to the BRF
- 7. Chairman's Remarks The chairman had very little to say apart from mentioning the call change competition which he felt was a fantastic occasion with nine bands entered. Everyone was very friendly towards each other, had a good tea and enjoyed the competition. He thanked everyone for their support.
- 8. Secretary's Report It has been an interesting year for the district with thirteen new members and one associate member joining the association.

Quarterly meetings were held at Ospringe, Elham and Throwley. The venues for the bye meetings were Herne, Eythorne followed by ringing at Deal and East Langdon with the service, tea and meeting at Walmer.

St Alphege Whitstable hosted an enjoyable Christmas Carol Service with delicious food and a quiz extravaganza to follow.

The ringing school was organised at two towers in February. Feedback was good. Details are in the ringing master's report.

The district hosted the County AGM at Chilham on Easter Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> April.

Only four bands entered the Striking Competition at Goodnestone in May where Canterbury St Dunstans were placed first. They went on to win the county competition at Seal in September. The Call Change Competition at Godmersham was won by Lyminge. Nine bands entered including some towers who hadn't participated for many years, if at all. One band contained two generations of the same family, mother and daughter whilst another had three generations of the same family, mother daughter and grandson. For all of these people it was their first competition ringing. A scratch band also added to the enjoyment.

The district competed in the county eight bell competition at Tunstall in June where they were placed third of five bands. Maidstone did not enter a band.

Attendance at meetings continues to hold up well but with the same faces every month. We need our new ringers to come along and also encourage those towers whose members never attend to come along and see what the district is all about.

Thanks must go to all the members and incumbents of the towers at which meetings were held during the year and also those members who supported these events.

Thanks are also due to the committee for attending committee meetings and keeping the district running smoothly.

The Secretary's report was adopted on a proposal from Cathryn Hills seconded by Allan Chandler.

9. Assistant /Competition Secretary's Report - The assistant secretary had not prepared a report but wished to endorse what the chairman had said about the call change competition in September. It had been a very good afternoon.

It was a lot easier organising the competitions by email rather than waiting for the post and he encouraged bands to enter both competitions in future years. He also suggested that certificates should be presented to all bands who took part.

**10. Treasurer's Report -** A copy of the interim accounts is attached to these minutes. Cathryn reported that most towers had paid their subscriptions but some members were still to pay. Income from the 120 club would be down this year due to the change to an April to March year, but this will be offset by monies raised by hosting the AGM on Easter Monday.

Subscriptions for the coming year will be £15 for adults and £7.50 for under 18s and are due on 1st January. The county committee are imposing a cut-off date for payment. Those who do not meet this date will have their names removed from the handbook.

The Treasurer's report was adopted on a proposal from David Cawley seconded by Debra Stickels.

11. Ringing Master's Report - We have experienced an enjoyable year as District Ringing Masters. We have had plenty of good ringing at district meetings and competitions since our last Annual District Meeting, and we hope, ringing that has been beneficial to everyone who has come along to any district meeting with the aim of trying to ring something new, broaden their experience of district towers, and to meet with old friends and make new acquaintances.

Two ringing schools were held in February, one focusing on Stedman held at St Stephen's, Canterbury, and one focusing on Plain Hunt held at St Peter-in-Thanet. Both schools attracted a lot of interest and were worthwhile events. We hope that everyone who attended feels that they gained from taking part. Ringing schools will be organised again for February next year. If towers are interested in organising their own ringing schools to cover specific aspects of ringing, please do not hesitate to contact the district committee as we would welcome the opportunity to give any event our help and support.

The District Quarter Peal Week was also held in the February half-term holiday this year, and 14 quarter peals were scored for this event during the week. Special congratulations must go to any ringers who achieved anything for the first time. For next year's week please don't hesitate to contact the ringing masters if your tower requires any assistance in arranging quarter peals, as it would be great to improve on this number and also achieve as many "firsts" as possible.

We have held District Surprise Major practices at Sheldwich, All Saints, Birchington-on-Sea, Selling and Hernhill. We have enjoyed these special practices and hope that district ringers attending them found them useful and enjoyable occasions.

The Canterbury District entered the KCACR Youth Striking Contest held at Kingsnorth and came a very creditable 3<sup>rd</sup>.

A band representing the Canterbury District competed in the County 8-Bell Striking Competition held at Tunstall in June, coming 3<sup>rd</sup>. St Dunstan's, Canterbury represented the District in the County 6-Bell Striking Competition held at Seal in September and were worthy champions!

A particular highlight of the year was the amount of ringing for the centenary of the Armistice on 11<sup>th</sup> November 2018. Many towers around the District participated in Ringing Remembers and Ringing out for Peace, and managed to swell their bands through the accompanying recruitment drive as well.

If any towers in the District have requests for help to teach and learn any aspect of ringing, or require help for ringing performances at special occasions, please do get in touch! We are encouraged by meeting many new ringers at district events, and hope this will continue throughout the coming year

**13. Report from the County Committee Meeting -** Neither of the District Representatives had attended the last meeting and so the secretary read out the bullet points received from the general secretary.

With regards to the Mini Ring project agreed at the AGM at Cranbrook nothing had been progressed by the county and it had been abandoned. David Cawley had recovered the bells which he had originally donated to the project.

The bookstall was to be withdrawn. Don Niblett reported that those books left in the district bookstall had been returned. The district committee had discussed this and proposed reviving it as a district bookstall. Claire Stay was prepared to take on the job suggesting that there were certain books which people need to see before they bought them and that it was important to have a small selection of books available at district meetings. The district would need to buy initial stock and money was available for this after which the stall will become self financing. David Cawley was prepared to offer a donation to get it started.

14. Future handbook provision - There has, as yet, been no information from the general committee concerning the provision and ordering arrangements for the 2020 handbook. As soon as this is received it will be passed on to tower contacts.

Towers and members were urged to ensure that subscriptions were paid as soon as possible in January. For 2019 those who were not shown on the membership database as having paid were not included in the handbook and some towers were shown as having no members.
