



The North West Ringing Course

Now open for applications

The new residential North West Ringing Course is now accepting applications. To apply as a student or a helper, please visit the website:

What will it cost?

The fees have worked out to be rather less than the somewhat conservative estimates given in earlier publicity, and are now set at £275 for students and £170 for helpers.

Please note that a number of Associations are offering bursaries to members wishing to attend the course, and other Associations are currently considering doing this. So it may be a good idea to contact your local Association and ask about financial assistance.

What are the other details?

The course runs from Thursday 11th through to Sunday 14th August 2022. We will meet at lunchtime on the Thursday for some introductory sessions, followed by ringing in the evening. Then there's a full programme on the Friday and Saturday, with the course ending at lunchtime on Sunday – though there will be optional ringing on Sunday afternoon at Liverpool Cathedral for those who don't have to rush home.

The base location for the course is Myerscough College, near Preston. The postcode is PR3 0RY.

The topics covered are the same as previously published, namely 'Moving on in Minor', 'From Six to Eight', 'Stedman', 'Basic Conducting' and 'Advanced Conducting'.

The website gives a description of each of these, and the application form allows you to list one or more topics, in order of preference. Please note all the topics are dependent on there being adequate demand.
