

Safequarding : DBS and Training Requirements

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	DBS Although individual parishes will decide who requires a DBS check, all Tower Captains/Ringing Masters and anyone teaching young persons (under 18) to ring must hold a current DBS certificate.	
TRAINING	<ul> <li><u>Courses</u></li> <li>All ringers must complete the online courses Basic Awareness (formerly known as C0) and it is desirable that they complete Foundation (formerly known as C1).</li> <li>All Tower Captains/Ringing Masters must complete the Leadership Pathway Course (formerly known as C2). (For Diocese of Chichester - Foundation is only required) This is applied for via Diocesan websites. This is in addition to taking the Basic Awareness and Foundation courses. This training must be undertaken every 3 years and reported to the Parish Safeguarding Officer. (For Diocese of Chichester - renewal of the higher-level safeguarding course currently held is only needed to be renewed every 3 years)</li> <li>All those teaching young persons (under 18) to ring must undertake the Basic Awareness and Foundation courses.</li> <li>Safer Recruitment and People Management online course for Tower Captains (as they are line managers and involved in the recruitment of bell ringers)</li> <li>We would encourage all church officers to complete the Raising Awareness of Domestic Abuse online</li> </ul>	
	training, although this is not a compulsory course.           Permission to Ring Form	
TMENT	This can be found on the KCACR website and it is advised that a form is held securely in the Tower for each young person (under 18) and vulnerable adult.

	<u>In the Tower</u> At least 2 adults must be present in the Tower when teaching young persons – ideally one male, one female and from different households. The correct ratios must be followed as per the Safer Environments and Activities Guidance. <u>https://www.churchofengland.org/sites/default/files/2019-11/safer-environment-and-activities- oct19_0.pdf</u>	

TOWER	Register It is good practice for all Towers to keep a register of attendees, whether ringers or not. This should be kept securely and according to GDPR Guidance.	
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All secular rings of bells should address safeguarding concerns with the KCACR Safeguarding Officer or in an emergency with the Police, Social Services or LADO (Local Authority Designated Officer)
