3. Minutes of Last Meeting

The minutes of the last Quarterly Meeting, held at Gillingham on 20th January 2024, were circulated prior to the meeting. They were agreed to be correct and were proposed by CH and seconded by NJ.

4. Matters arising

a. Posting meeting minutes to the KCACR website

The minutes of these meetings are now being posted to the KCACR website. All attendees names have been abbreviated to initials for GDPR reasons, however, this may make them difficult to follow. Attendees were asked if they object to having their full name published in the attending section of the minutes posted on the website. No objections were raised.

b. KCACR AGM Feedback

The KCACR AGM was held on Easter Monday, 1st April 2024, in the Rochester District at St Margaret, Rainham. They welcome Joanne Pohl, from Rochester, as the new general secretary. Sue Bassett, leaving that post, is the new association training officer. They wish to publicise that there is money available in the Training Fund. This is used to fund ART M1 and M2 training free to members and the expenses for Kent Young Ringers. It could also be used to provide simulators and associated equipment to support training projects. They welcome other applications for training expenses.

c. Results of Striking Competition

6-bell method competition:

Thank you to Doug Davis for judging. This was the first call change competition held in the Rochester District since 2019.

d. Proposed Rochester District Rules for 6-bell Striking Competitions

The KCACR striking competition rules are not really appropriate for district competitions. It is proposed that some district rules are formulated. Some suggestions were read out, but this did not seem like the time for an extended discussion. It was suggested that the committee look at various old rules and draft a proposal for review at the next quarterly meeting. This was proposed by NJ and seconded by CH.

Action: Committee to discuss and agree a proposal for district striking competition rules.

e. ART ringing hubs

Please encourage your learners and M1 (bell handling) teachers to sign up. Report from Steve Fitton: The Milton Regis hub (7:30 - 9 pm every other Monday) is going well, with teachers numbering between 5 and 8 and students between 8 and 12. I

understand that some of the other hubs have not fared quite as well, but I don't have numbers. The majority of the current students are at a point in their training where they would benefit more from ringing rounds and call changes, but this would come under M2 training hubs. Currently I'm not aware of any M2 hubs in Kent but we are looking to run some later in the year.

NJ: There may be an M2 training hub at Rochester Cathedral on 31st August, however, this is yet to be confirmed.

g. Firsts Month

RJ: This year in the Rochester District we are holding a 'Firsts Month' from 20th April to 20th May. This timeline includes both the district striking competition, and the district practice at Swanscombe: good opportunities to score firsts!

The purpose of the month is both to encourage members to stretch themselves to try new things, and to celebrate firsts at every level, from first time ringing a bell unassisted, to participating in your first striking competition. If you are proud of it, we want to know about it.

Other examples of firsts could be: ringing for Sunday service, calling your first touch, ringing in your first method, calling your first call changes, organising your first tower tour etc. We will be setting up an event on BellBoard which can be used to record your firsts. Wouldn't it be great if every ringing tower in the district was able to make a submission?

The district is happy to help with support, but please let us know sooner rather than later if this is required.

An event titled, "Rochester District Firsts Month", has been set up on Bellboard. The performance does not have to be a quarter or peal, it is possible to record general ringing with one person named and add the first, e,g, spliced bell rope.

Detailed instructions for linking to the event on Bellboard:

Submit your piece of ringing as usual.

Then go into 'amend' on the left hand side

Select the piece of ringing you want to add

Click 'edit' at the top

Select 'add to event'

There will be a drop-down box of the events you can add to, and Rochester District Firsts Month will be among them.

Click on that and then Save!
