

I was introduced to ringing using the "One per Learner" series, one of the Sherbourne Teaching Aids series. Many tower captains are aware of these, however don't forget that there are other useful items in this series, such as the "Bell Club" scheme. It's a useful pack including personal record cards for your learners and achievement badges to encourage your new recruits.

The record cards are particularly useful as they break down learning to handle into distinct stages. Learners can see that they are making progress even though they may come away from tied bell session a little dispirited.

JUST AN IDEA

Back in January at the last District Meeting, Peter Swift mentioned to a number of the "soon to be members" of the "Ring in 2,000" committee a possible fund raising idea to go hand in hand with any other events the district might care to arrange.

Peter has kindly allowed the committee to run with it, and we would like to discuss our thoughts to date at the next district meeting.

Greenwich - "The Millennium Tower."

Since the district has within it, the ultimate "Millennium Tower" in the form of Greenwich, with all its associations with time and the Greenwich Meridian, perhaps this could form the basis of a fund raising event.

Peter Swift has said that he would be prepared to compose a special quarter peal of 2,000 changes to be rung on New Year's day 2,000. With the agreement of all the relevant parties this could become a fund raising project for the new millennium, with ropes being "sold or auctioned" off to ringers in the quarter.

The following points need to be considered:

- Fundraising is the district prepared to support such an event
- 2. Suitable Projects the district needs to decide what project to support. These would appear to fall into two major categories:
 - "Bricks & Mortar" a project to raise money for the refitting or improvement of a specific tower
 - "People" a project to raise money to further the training of new ringers. A bursary scheme to help with costs of residential courses for ringers could be an option.
- 3. How wide to cast the net to a lesser extent, how wide do we want to cast the fund raising net. District, County, or Country wide.

We would like a decision from the members of the district on this suggestion. The "Ring in 2,000" committee have discussed this and the general feelings are that we should go

ahead with such a fund raiser. The project should be used to raise funds specifically to support a training bursary, with the bursary being open to members of the K.C.A.C.R to apply for

Clearly details will need to be thrashed out in the coming months, however outline support at this stage is needed before researching the matter further.

Please come to the meeting with your thoughts - we will be interested to hear them.

Minutes of the Quarterly Meeting held at The Annunciation, Chislehurst, on Saturday, 10th January 1998

The Chairman, Mr. J. J. Rooke, opened the meeting by welcoming everyone, particularly Mr. & Mrs. I. H. Oram and their daughter.

1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence were received from Mr. A. J. Britton of Bexley, Miss M. J. Wilkins of Chelsfield, Mr. M. Jones of St. Nicholas, Chislehurst, Mrs. R. Backhouse of Christ Church, Erith, Mr. & Mrs. J. Morris of St. John's, Erith, and Mr. N. Pointer of St. Mary Cray.

2. MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

The minutes of the last meeting, which had been circulated, were confirmed and signed.

3. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

Welcome Pack for New Members

Mrs. Hill, in her capacity as District Representative, explained that she had been unable to stay until the end of the General Committee Meeting so had not raised the question of the Association having a welcome pack for new members. She did, however, point out that since a decision had been taken not to raise subscriptions in 1999, the Association was working to a very tight budget and she felt it was unlikely that funds would be available for this purpose.

4. CORRESPONDENCE

The Secretary had received:

- a. ... a letter from Mr. Britton asking her to convey his (as the 1997 District Carol Service's Choir Conductor) thanks to everyone who supported the Carol Service at Bexley in December, particularly choir members and those who read the lessons.
- b. ... an invitation from the Australian and New Zealand Association of Bellringers to take part in an International Striking Competition in April 2001. There appeared to be no interest in this proposal.
- c. ... training notices had been received from Mrs. Catherine Lewis for individual towers and these had been distributed as far as possible.

Votes of Thanks

Mr. R. D. Bing proposed votes of thanks to Mr. Don Hopgood, a Pastoral Assistant at The Annunciation, for conducting the service, to Mr. Frank Seabrook for playing the organ and to Mr. R. A. Long and the Chislehurst ringers for preparing and serving an excellent tea.

Collection

The collection which had been taken at the service amounted to just over £43.00 and was to be given to Bromley Welfare.

Training and District Practices

Mr. Hardy said that he planned to run a Bob Doubles Training Day on 29th August. A general practice had been arranged for 31st January from 7 - 9 p.m. at St. Mary Cray. At this he hoped to receive feed-back about future practices that members of the District would like him to arrange. He expressed himself happy to arrange practices but only if they were going to be well supported.

Arts Fair

Mrs. Eastaugh referred to her suggestion made at the Annual Meeting that the District should consider joining the Bexley Arts Council so that a stand could taken at the Hall Place Arts Fair in Bexley at a reduced rate (£15.00) to promote ringing in the area. There seemed little interest in this suggestion and Mrs. Hardy, who had offered to investigate the Live Craft programme, said that this was still to be published.

Quarter Peals

Mr. Byers said that he and the Ringing Master would be happy to arrange quarter peals for anyone who wanted to ring one.

Leaflets

Miss Vale mentioned that she had a supply of free yellow leaflets about the Association and Mr. Byers had produced a recruitment leaflet which could be adapted for the requirements of individual towers.

Millennium Recruitment and Ringing

Prompted by Mrs. Hill there was a discussion about millennium recruitment and ringing and it was agreed to form a small committee to consider the implications. Specific suggestions included the proposal that Miss Rooke should be invited to act as Co-ordinator of the group (Miss Rooke said that at present work commitments would prevent this but that she would be interested in becoming involved later in the year), that good use should be made of the fact that Greenwich was in the District, and that a feature should appear in the free papers. Initially, it was decided on the proposition of Mrs. Hardy, seconded by Mrs. Pointer, that anyone interested should wait behind after the meeting to have a further brief discussion.

There being no further business, the Chairman closed the meeting and members went to St. Nicholas, Chislehurst, for evening ringing.
