We could wander about the churchyard, have tea and visit a local garage that had been turned into a bric-a-brac stall which was fundraising for the restoration of the stair turret on the side of Yalding tower, which is slowing coming away from the wall!

Alan Ainsworth started his summing-up by explaining that

they'd taken a long time to separate two bands at the top, using the tape recordings they had made throughout. He didn't say very much about each team's performance, except to comment on their speed. The results were as follows:

Having rung bells for approximately a year, and having developed an affinity, not only for the sound but the gentle yet swift motion used to ring the instruments, the members of our band at St Mark's Biggin Hill, decided to try a more challenging approach to the sport – ringing methods.



With two experienced ringers and six novices this proved to be a greater task than anticipated, and even ringing Plain Hunt seemed a continual conflict between what you wanted to ring and what the bell wanted to ring. Finally Plain Hunt sounded recognisable, but only as we had each learnt the method "by numbers", so week after week everyone rang the same bells and neither improved nor decreased in our ability.

Several vain attempts at trying to ring by "places" lead to discouragement, so Nancy (our tower captain) decided to arrange a "Plain Hunt Day (later shortened to a Plain Hunt Evening) and after consulting Philippa – a very learned yet helpful ringing guru – it actually happened.

An hour and a half later, everyone was very tired and aching, not to mention glowing with perspiration, but we had (kind of) learnt to ring by places.

Philippa helped by yelling out where to go and what place we were in as we rang Plain Hunt on five, even throwing in "funny rounds" to stop us just thinking of numbers. Although a little intimidating, it worked (for me) and I now understand the principle as well.

However, the six bells in our tower are plenty enough – I am yet to experience trying to ring by places on 10 or 12 bells.

2. MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

Mr Mark Backhouse requested that there be appended to the section of Any Other Business relating to St John's Erith, that the peal attempt the clapper of the seventh had fallen out, and also that the bells at St John's are not available for peals in the future.

Subject to the above amendment, the minutes of the last meeting, which had been circulated, were confirmed and signed on the proposition of Mr Mark Backhouse, seconded by Mrs Cathy Cheeseman.

3. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

There was no further news on the progress of the Welcome Pack.

The Beckenham open day had been very successful.

There were no other matters arising from the minutes.

4. CORRESPONDENCE

County Inter District 8 bell Striking Competition.

Following the competition on the 26th June at Beckenham Mrs Sara Hardy had written to Mr T Wraight, the Secretary of the KCACR, on the subject of teas provided to the teams.

The instructions to each of the Districts for the competition had clearly stated that tea would be provided for the six teams participating, unless the districts specifically requested that they did not require tea for their team. None of the teams took steps to cancel their teas. During the course of tea, individuals were asked to provide a donation to cover the costs of providing tea; in this case £1.50 per head. At the end of the afternoon £45 had been received, considerably less than the £72 that would have been expected from the 48 teas provided. Clearly this either indicated that several teams had not had the courtesy to phone to cancel their teas, or alternatively several individuals had not made a contribution to the cost of tea. It was this point that Mrs Hardy raised with Mr Wraight in her letter.

Mr Wraight had replied that he would be bringing it to the attention of the County Chairman and Treasurer. He would also be writing to all the District Secretaries about this, asking them to initiate discussion of the three solutions proposed in Mrs Hardy's letter at their next District Meeting.

The three proposals were

- A 'no name no tea' approach should be taken
- Tea should not be the usual "ringers tea" but merely consist of tea and biscuits
- Teams should be requested to pay an entry fee of £ 15 per band to cover the costs of tea.

A brief discussion then ensued, which ranged across a variety of tea matters. It was the general feeling of the meeting that the option of charging an entry fee should be adopted for County Competitions. The Chairman then asked if the meeting felt there was a similar problem at District level. After discussion it was concluded that there was not, but if such an occasion arose, the matter could be dealt with at a later date.

There is a poster being circulated to all towers which should be returned by 31st August to each tower's Millennium Committee representative, or alternatively directly to Mrs Sara Hardy.


