Once again financial matters dominated the meeting.

- 1) Total grants of £9,500 were recommended by the Bell Restoration Fund subcommittee . Increased donations are now needed for the B.R.F . More money from districts and covenanting were among the suggestions.
- 2) The treasurer confirmed that the K.C.A.C.R is now a registered charity.
- 3) District representatives reported back on the "100 Club". Although the response was not overwhelming it was agreed that the treasurer would look into its organisation.

There was much discussion as to marking the year 2000. Several suggestions were put forward and considered and a vote was taken. It was decided that the committee would make no official recommendation.

It was reported that the Holy Week training course was successful and another course is being organised for the 28th October For details contact Andrew Young.
