

Minutes of the Quarterly Meeting to be held at Crayford on Saturday, 13th April 1996

The Chairman, Mr. Jim Rooke, opened the meeting by welcoming everyone, particularly the General Secretary, Mr. Tim Wraight, and Mrs. Wraight.

DEATH

Members stood in silence in memory of Mr. Alan Hall of Bexley who died on 18th February.

1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence were received from Mrs. Ann Saunders and Miss Hannah Saunders of Bexley, Mr. John Hill of Christ Church, Erith, and Mr. Bill Lanyon of Woolwich.

2. MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

The minutes of the last meeting, which had been circulated, were confirmed and signed on the proposition of Dr. Andrew Young, seconded by Miss Freda Cannon.

3. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

Carol Service on 14th December

Mrs. Nancy Robins offered to see whether it would be possible to hold the Carol Service at Crayford and, failing this, the Secretary undertook to approach the Vicar of Bexley to see if it could be held at St. Mary's. This arrangement was accepted by a majority.

4. CORRESPONDENCE

The Chairman read to the meeting two letters which the Secretary had received from the General Secretary, the first expressing condolences to the Bexley ringers and to the District on the death of Mr. Alan Hall, and informing her that a peal of Glasgow had been rung at St. Michael's, Maidstone, in his memory; and the second expressing a very warm vote of thanks to everyone who had been involved in the arrangements for the Association's Annual General Meeting, which had been held at Sidcup the previous Monday.

The Secretary had also received some information from The Ringing World regarding notices and news items. She said that she had given an extract from this letter to Mr. Patrick Braund for the District's next Newsletter.

5. a. ELECTION OF NEW MEMBERS

No new members were elected.

b. RATIFICATION OF ELECTIONS MADE PREVIOUS TO PEALS

The election of Mr. Nicholas Wilkins and Miss Angela Wilkins of Chelsfield prior to a peal attempt on 2nd March was ratified on the proposition of Mr. Jim Rooke, seconded by Miss Philippa Rooke.

6. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Car Treasure Hunt

Mr. Braund said that he had with him entry forms for the Car Treasure Hunt and stressed that a minimum of twelve entries were needed for this event to run successfully and make a worthwhile profit for the Bell Restoration Fund. In view of the fact that it had been decided to hold the Treasure Hunt on a Sunday afternoon, Mr. Braund enquired

whether members wanted him to arrange a 'mystery tower'. Since members seemed undecided about this, Dr. Young suggested, and it was agreed, that members should indicate on their entry forms whether or not they had to return to their own tower for evening ringing.

Sweat Shirts

Miss Jessica Vale reminded members about the Association's sweat shirts etc. and asked that orders should be given to her.

10-Bell Striking Competition

Dr. Young informed the meeting that the District had re-gained the 10-bell Striking Competition trophy in a Competition at Ashford. The trophy had been placed in the ringing room at Beckenham.

Ringing Programme

Dr. Young had brought to the meeting, and distributed, new ringing programmes. It was pointed out that the Plain Bob Workshop in August was on the 10th, not the 8th, and that the date chosen for the Carol Service was 14th December, not the 7th.

Bickley

Dr. Young explained that when the District received the tax rebate from the county, which was still being calculated, we would have reached the target for the Appeal. A plaque would be placed in the belfry at St. George's and if there was any surplus in the fund it would be given to the Bell Restoration Fund. Arrangements had been made for a peal attempt at Bickley later in the month to mark the closing of the Appeal. The dedication of the plaque would take place in the course of a service during the summer.

Safety

Mr. Wraight gave details of a ringing accident where someone had been carrying out maintenance on his own in a tower and had fallen down a ladder and ended up in hospital for several days. He stressed the advisability of always having two people in a tower while maintenance was being carried out. If this was impossible, then the person carrying out the work should tell someone to look for him/her if he/she was not back by a specified time. Dr. Young suggested that it was wise to leave someone in the ringing room, particularly if it was not possible to lock the tower door. Also on the subject of safety, Mr. Braund said that trap doors often gave cause for concern. Arrangements were in hand for a new trap door and a new ladder to be provided at Cudham to avoid the problems of a vertical ladder and a heavy trap door. Other safety suggestions were that the Steeplekeeper might carry a mobile phone; and that a ring could be placed round a ladder, thus providing something on which to lean while operating a trap door.

Handbells

Mr. David Osenton said that the Crayford ringers would be interested in borrowing, or possibly buying, a set of handbells.

Vote of Thanks

Dr. Young proposed a vote of thanks to the Rector of St. Paulinus, the Rev. Paul Wright, for conducting the service and for the use of the bells, to Mr. Jeremy Ducker, one of the local ringers, for playing the organ, and to Mrs. Robins and the Crayford band for making the local arrangements and providing tea.



REPORT OF COMMITTEE MEETING 4TH MAY 1996

A seminar entitled Sharing Good Practice is to be held at Southwark Cathedral on the 12th October. CCCB are organising this.

A letter was received from Rainham suggesting that a levy of £10 per tower be paid into the BRF. This was put on hold until more serious financial matters had been discussed and resolved.

Assets insurance still has to be assessed and will be discussed further with Ian Oram

There has been no volunteer to organise the 100 Club and this item has been closed for the present.

Dr. Sue Atkinson will be responsible for the future ordering of sweatshirts but at -present discussions are taking place as to the possibility of using other suppliers/ manufacturers.

It was reported that the 'Teaching to Teach' training sessions held in Holy Week were successful although there was a low take up in numbers attending. Districts reported that it had been a useful exercise. Two more training days have been arranged. Details from Andrew Young.

The publicity committee has not met for some time but is was felt that we should do more to publicise the works and aims of the KCACR. We are looking at other associations to see how they handle their publicity.

The BRF has purchased a second-hand 2 ton Chain Lift which would improve the removing/replacing of heavier bells. The association is looking for secure storage for valuable bell items.

A full and detailed report was given by the Working Parties concerning Database. Basically what we are aiming to do is to keep accurate records of our membership and all that this entails. There will be a few copies of this report at the July meeting.

There was a very full discussion concerning the associations finances. We are hoping that the 1994 accounts will be audited by the lighther 31st July and the 1995 accounts by the 31st August. Once these have been done the new Treasurer will be able to take over all the accounts and call for an Extra Meeting should it be necessary. There is an increasing workload in dealing with the finances and it could be that the Treasurer will need assistance. Lewisham District is still waiting for confirmation of the rebate on the Centenary Fund.

To clear the stock of videos it was agreed to charge $\mathcal{L}4$ to members of the association and $\mathcal{L}5$ to non-members.

The General Secretary drew the meeting's attention to a tower accident which could have been very serious. He advised members when working on bells to 1) always have at least two people working together, and 2) if unable to have two people present, always inform some person, and agree the time period you will be in the tower.

Summary

This Working Group was set up at the November 1995 County Committee meeting to investigate the issues concerning the implementation of a computerised membership database by January 1997. We have completed our initial review and believe it is feasible, and in the interests of the Association, to have such a system. Because a computer system dedicated solely to the Association's use would be disproportionately expensive, and grossly under-utilized we believe the most appropriate course is for a Membership Secretary to be appointed who will not only be responsible for administering the database but also able to provide the computing resources. The Association would be responsible for defraying general expenses (such as printing paper, floppy disks for storage etc.).

In setting up such a system care must be taken to ensure the Association acts within the law and is able to support this system over a long period of time. We believe it is not necessary for the Association to register itself as a Data User under the Data Protection Act; this does not mean we do not have to consider the Act, on the contrary by not registering we have certain legal duties. Initially the Association's best interests are likely to be served by implementing the database using a general database application hosted on a commonly available Personal Computer.

A Membership Secretary should be selected, and if necessary co-opted onto the County Committee. The Working Group and Membership Secretary should be tasked with providing a detailed implementation of the database system in time for the November Committee meeting. The Association should adopt a formal membership application form such as that indicated in Appendix B. The suggestions in this report on how the database might be used to help administer the Association's business should be considered by the County and District Committees and any comments forwarded to the Working Group as soon as possible.
