# 3. Minutes of Last Meeting

# a. Feedback on Quarter Peal Month

There were 17 quarter peals completed by the Rochester District (including 2 that weren't linked to the event on Bellboard). There were more quarters attempted, but some were lost! They were completed at 12 towers; Milton Regis (with 5 quarters) was the leading tower. There were 12 quarters of doubles, 1 of minor and 2 each of triples and major. Congratulations to all who rung in quarters and partial quarters.

#### b. Feedback on KCACR Evensong

There were over 50 attendees at the KCACR Evensong, held at Canterbury Cathedral. There was ringing prior to the service, a fine spread of light refreshments and the opportunity to look at the recently acquired personal ringing records of the late David Cawley and Vernon Benning, some dating back to the 1940s, including many photographs.
